## Turtles and Where They Live



Explore turtles and the amazing wetlands in which they live with a visit by the Ithaca Children's Garden

Typically one and half to two hours in length, in this program we'll find out all about where turtles and their friends live with interactive stories, building our own 3-D turtle habitats and planting a turtle sprout.

We'll take a "Peek at a Pond" buzzing like dragonflies, creeping like salamanders, and sunning like turtles. Using what we learned we'll color and glue together our own turtle habitats. Afterwards we will plant our own turtle, one whose shell will actually grow. Then it's time to explore "In a Small, Small Pond."

## Spring into Gardening



Spring into Gardening with a visit by the Ithaca Children's Garden.

Choose a one or two hour program to include, planting a "Salad Bowl" container garden, creating a "Pansy Pot" (painting terra cotta pots and transplanting spring annual flowers) interactive story telling, and an indoor or outdoor active game.

### One Hour Program:

Planting a "Salad Bowl" or Pansy Pots and an Interactive Story or an Active Game

### Two Hour Program:

Planting a "Salad Bowl," creating Pansy Pots, an Interactive Story, and an Active Game

## Field Trips to the Garden



Two hours in length, your field trip starts with an introduction to Garden and the plants and animals that live there. We'll listen for birds, look for worms, touch lambs ear leaves, and smell the pizza and bubblegum herbs.

Since there's always gardening to do, everyone will get a chance to pull some weeds, cultivate the soil, and plant seeds or transplants of flowers and vegetables, including something to take home.

No visit to the Garden is complete without some time with Gaia the Turtle so we always save a bit at the end for playing on her back.

Field trips are scheduled for the morning or afternoon. We will gladly make time for a snack break. Please be sure at least one adult chaperone for each five children will be present.
